



- Day 12: Check out of your hostel or guesthouse and take a bus to Jerusalem. Depart from Jerusalem.

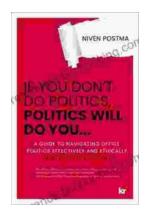

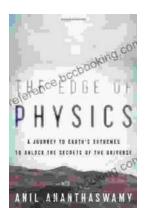
