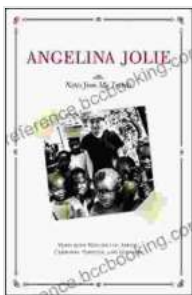

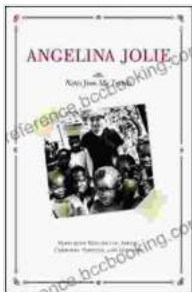
A Call to Action

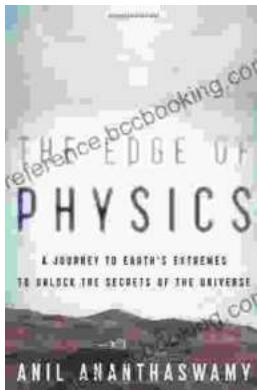
